History of the League

The Norfolk Christian Football Leage is one of the longest-standing church leagues in the whole country and can trace its history back almost 40 years. Alan Barnes reports.

A friendly football match in Norwich on Boxing Day morning of 1967 between Surrey Chapel and South Park Chapel was the first-ever recorded inter-church game and started off the process towards the formation of a league proper in 1978 following friendly matches between halfa-dozen teams over the next ten years.

The early years' pioneer of the league was Don Wilson from Surrey Chapel. All matches were played at Earlham Park and it was not until the late 1980s that teams started to have their own home pitches.

In 1980, Maurice Wood, Bishop of Norwich at the time, agreed to sponsor a cup competition. The final was played at Carrow Road in front of a small, enthusiastic, crowd and saw Surrey Chapel narrowly beat Holy Trinity.

The next two finals were played at Carrow Road, with Salvation Army and YMCA as winners.

By the early 1980s, the league had grown to 12 teams including, Assemblies of God, Norwich Christian Fellowship, Dereham Road Baptist Church, Mount Zion. Some churches joined together to form teams: Meadow Way Chapel joined with Oak Grove Chapel, Hillcrest Chapel joined with Belvoir Street.

From 1983, the finals have been played at grounds including Norwich City's former training ground at Trowse, Mulbarton FC, Dereham Town FC, Wroxham FC and, more recently, the FDC at Bowthorpe. More teams from outside the city joined over this period including from North Walsham, Aylsham, Yarmouth, Dereham and Stalham.

Wroxham Road Boys' Brigade was one of the most successful teams of the 1990s and early 2000s, keeping their original squad together for many years. When they finished, they donated a trophy for the shield competition, for clubs knocked out in the first round of the cup.

In the late 1990s, Tim Stapleford had a vision to extend the league to include youth football. Many children in churches found it difficult to play competitive football as it took place on a Sunday. The youth league, played on a Saturday morning, provided that opportunity. Initially games took place at the UEA Sportspark. All six pitches were used and the league grew into four age-group sections from Under 10s to Under 16s. Cup finals were also played at the venue.

Into the new century and clubs started using their own pitches and teams from outside the city began to join the league including Broadland Lads from North Walsham, Brooke Adventurers, Lighthouse Church from Sheringham and teams from Happisburgh and Catfield.

Some teams have been part of the league almost from the very beginning. Brooke Adventurers and St Johns are still going strong and each year field teams in most of the age categories.

Naturally, competitive football is very important to all the teams involved but, as a Christian league, the way that teams approach the matches and interact with each other is just as important. During the 1990s, the Fellowship Trophy was instigated and is presented to teams which, over the course of the season, have demonstrated that element of fair play as judged by their opponents.

We hope that today's finals will be both competitive and demonstrate the Christian ethos of the league. Today will be the 37th playing of the Bishop Maurice Wood Cup and those involved will remember the occasion for a long time to come. We pray that the league will remain strong over the coming years and that our aim of linking Church to Community through Football will continue to influence all involved.
