From Spark to Screen; the creative power of Julian of Norwich

Artist, writer and film maker Sally-Anne Lomas reflects upon how an encounter with Julian of Norwich while studying at Norwich Art School has influenced her life and creative practice - including producing and directing the BBC4 documentary Julian of Norwich; the search for the lost manuscript - winner of the Royal Television Society East Award for Best Factual Programme 2017.

Presenter Janina Ramirez, whose book is available at the Julian Centre. writes: 'I worked with Sally-Anne on the Julian of Norwich documentary which brought a greater awareness of her significance to the nation. It was Sally-Anne's brainchild, born out of decades spent engaging with Julian's life and work. She crafted a documentary that was full of insights, information and ideas, bringing Julian back to people's attention in a unique and passionate way.'
